

Welcome to Garendon Park

Garendon Park has been opened to the public for the first time in centuries.

The Park began as a Cistercian Monastery in the 13th Century. You can see the stones of Garendon Abbey in the wall as you walk towards the footpath into the Park.

The Park surrounding Garendon Hall was landscaped in the 1730s, including several fantastic monuments include a Temple and an “Arc de Triumph”. The Hall was demolished in 1964 but the landscape remained.

The restoration and opening of the Park and its structures was a condition of planning permission for a substantial housing development. Whilst the housing development is on the north side, we have access to the Park today via a footpath several yards up the lane north of the Obelisk.
